

### **Filtering and Monitoring**



Whilst in the classroom, students are monitored when on devices by the class teacher and/or Teaching assistant



We also have constant vigilance of internet use via a specialist monitoring platform.



> I get too nervous to sit mocks/exams



### Transition to Post 16

#### Which Qualifications?

#### A levels

- Choose three or four subjects for a personalised combination
- Exam based assessment

#### > BTEC or other vocational qualifications

- Study different aspects of one vocational area
- Mainly coursework-based assessment
- Level 3 courses are the equivalent of three A levels

#### A levels & vocational qualifications

Combine two A levels and one vocational course

#### > Apprenticeships

- A combination of work and study
- Typically, four days work with one day at college
- · Earn as you learn

#### > T-Levels

- Launched in 2020 in collaboration with employers to meet needs of industry
- Equivalent to 3 A levels
- 80% in classroom, 20% in workplace


